RESOLUTION TO APPOINT HEARING OFFICER TO CONDUCT A SECTION 504 DUE PROCESS PROCEEDING

WHEREAS, a parent of a student in the Northern Adirondack Central School District (hereinafter referred to as the "District"), has requested a due process hearing in accordance with Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973; and

WHEREAS, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 requires the District to conduct an impartial due process hearing by a hearing officer who is not employed by the District but is knowledgeable of Section 504;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Northern Adirondack Central School District hereby appoints Alfred T. Riccio, as the Hearing Officer on this matter, and authorizes the Hearing Officer to hear evidence, make a transcript of proceedings, and to issue a written report of his findings to the parties; and

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER RESOLVED that Mr. Riccio shall be paid at the rate of \$750.00 per day for his services as Hearing Officer.

NORTHERN ADIRONDACK CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT RESOLUTION OF FEBRUARY 10, 2014 IN RESPONSE TO THE 2014-2015 EXECUTIVE BUDGET PROPOSAL

Whereas, public school districts that serve the less wealthy communities across the state are focused on the Governor's January 2014 Executive Budget proposal; and

Whereas, the January 2014 Executive Budget proposal would place the Northern Adirondack Central School District in an exceedingly poor financial position, potentially setting conditions for the Board of Education to identify yet another round of cost reductions below the level of programs and services identified one year ago as "essential" to adequately prepare our students for success in careers and college; and

Whereas, the New York State Educational Conference Board, a coalition of seven major statewide education associations, including the New York State School Boards Association, determined that school districts would need \$1.5 billion in new formula state aid, along with what they could raise locally under the property tax cap, just to sustain current educational programs and services; and

Whereas the State should eliminate the Gap Elimination Adjustment GEA during the next two fiscal years, with a top priority on doing so for the less wealthy school districts and communities throughout the State, particularly those in and around the Adirondack Park and Lake Champlain regions; therefore

Be it resolved, that this Board of Education strongly urges the Governor and Legislature to act decisively and promptly to provide a substantially more adequate level of state aid for public school districts across New York State, consistent with the New York State Educational Conference Board's 2014-2015 state aid request of a minimum of \$1.5 billion in additional formula state aid, to help maintain current instructional programs during the 2014-2015 school year. That amount of additional formula state aid would help address the limitations imposed by the tax cap on the ability to raise local revenue.
